It is important that your grant is used effectively and based on school need. The <u>Education Inspection</u> <u>Framework</u> (Ofsted 2019 p64) makes clear there will be a focus on 'whether leaders and those responsible for governors all understand their respective roles and perform these in a way that enhances the effectiveness of the school'.


We recommend you start by reflecting on the impact of current provision and reviewing the previous spend.

In our schools our younger children (Year 2 and 3) swim in weekly lessons at the local swimming pool. Given the area in which the children live and their proximity to the River Nidd, it is the school's decision that all children from Y2 upwards can at least swim /stay afloat for long enough before being rescued. Therefore, despite the fact that all children during their time in the schools have attended swimming lessons, it is unknown how many Year 6 children are able to swim 25m at the end of KS2.
