

Covid Cases in school As we see a rise in cases nationally here at school we too have had a couple of positive cases. If a child has **any symptoms** then they must take a PCR and remain at home in isolation pending the outcome of the test. I appreciate that this is very challenging as primary school children often have coughs and colds at this time of the year and we can't tell the difference between a 'normal' cough and covid cough, but we need to be extra cautious. Persistent cough, loss of taste and smell and a temperature are the main symptoms that you must look out for and help us keep the virus under control. We wish those members of our school community currently with covid, a speedy recovery.

And finally We seem to have had an increase of toys being brought into school from home. Please can I ask that children keep their toys safe at home and not bring them in? I know that it sounds really miserable to make such a request but a lost or broken toy causes huge upset here in school! Thank you.
