Attendance I have a statutory duty to monitor attendance and punctuality and act upon any attendance that is a cause for concern. If a child's attendance dips below 95% then I have to investigate the reasons why. More often than not, of late, children's attendance is directly attributed to a school request asking them to be at home either because of covid, because of being a close contacts of a positive case or because of a sickness bug. This

however makes a nonsense of the whole attendance issue - basically, schools have been encouraged to send children home, but are now asking parents to improve their child's poor attendance! It is non-sensical but it is an area that I will be challenged on by the LA or Ofsted under the 'Behaviour and Attitudes' section of the inspection schedule. Thank you for your understanding in this.

And finally...we have had two Positive Cases in Wharfe Class and following advice from PHE England, we have had to isolate the class from the rest of the school. This simply means that they will be kept separate from everybody else for a period of 7 days; they will have their lunch in the classroom and will not be attending assemblies or swimming. This really illustrates the importance of daily LFD testing so, if you have a child in Wharfe Class, then you must continue to test them daily so any other cases can be identified as early as possible.
