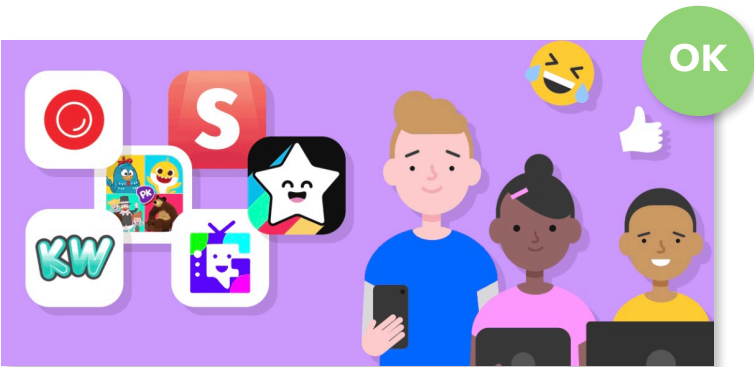
Seb in Year 3 said:
