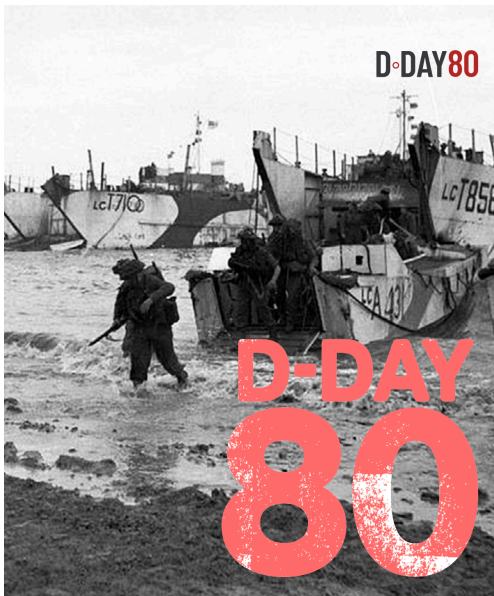


Class Arrangements 2024 With numbers growing throughout the school we have had to give careful consideration to our class arrangements for September 2024. Our school will continue to operate with the same structure as it has this year - Nursery in Nidd Class, Reception and Year 1 in Ribble Class (22 children), Year 2 and 3 in Swale Class (19 children) and Year 4, 5 and 6 in Wharfe Class (30 children). Additional adult support will be distributed throughout the school where the need is greatest so that our children can benefit from the skills of both our teachers and teaching assistants.

The Multiplication Check The multiplication tables check (MTC) is statutory for all year 4 pupils registered at state-funded maintained schools, special schools or academies, including free schools, in England. The purpose of the MTC is to determine whether pupils can recall their times tables fluently, which is essential for future success in mathematics. It will help schools to identify pupils who have not yet mastered their times tables, so that additional support can be provided. 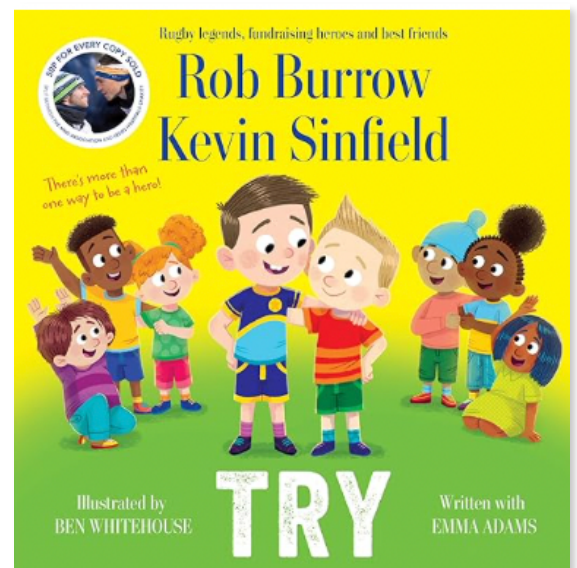
