Our priorities link to the five areas and are briefly summarised below:

Quality of Education - To raise standards in core subject areas (RWM); to continue to monitor the effectiveness of our curriculum.

Behaviour and Attitudes - To further improve pupils' attitudes to learning and to introduce OPAL (Outdoor Play and Learning) as a tool to develop conflict resolution.

Personal Development - To increase extra curricular opportunities for pupils; to develop the theme of DREAMs (Fundamental British Values) to underpin everything we do (see below).

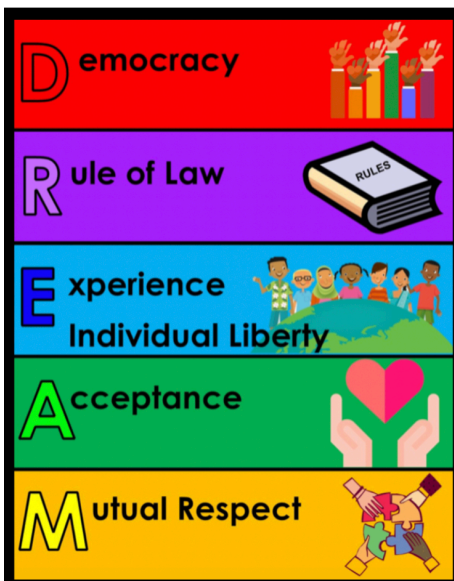
