What a year we have had! When I reflect on the year that we have had I believe there are many aspects of school life to celebrate. Our results in Early Years, our Year 1 phonics, our Year 4 Multiplication Times Table Check and our Key Stage 2 results have all contributed to a solid academic performance over the year. Combined with the broader aspects of school life such as the embedding of fundamental British values and protected characteristics has ensured that our children have developed a deeper understanding of complex issues in an age appropriate and timely way. Attendance continues to be a focus for all schools and I am pleased that we have managed to maintain similar rates of attendance to last year which is in line with national expectations (95%). We must not become complacent however, and attendance will continue to be closely monitored from September. Please be aware that should you request a leave of absence which equates to 10 sessions (2 sessions per day) within a four month period, a fixed penalty notice will be issued by the Local Authority. Staffing wise, we aim to consolidate on the stability that we have achieved this year as we look ahead to 2026 - 27.
